Al, who brought with him extensive leadership experience from Minor Baseball and Minor Hockey, was eventually elected to the Bradford West Gwillimbury Seniors Association Administrative Board as a Member-at-Large, and later as Facilities Director of the Danube Centre.

When it became apparent that the traditional autumn craft sale at the Danube Centre had run its course, Al teamed up with the late Bill Burlton to create the Green Valley Craft Group, which organized our first (and, so far, only) outside vendor Craft Show and Sale in November 2019. It was a huge success and there were plans for a second annual event, but COVID-19 got in the way.

Most recently, Al could be seen taking charge of the regular Thursday afternoon Euchre

game, greeting participants and counting out prize money. And his garden behind the Centre produced more cherry tomatoes than any other.

### **IMPORTANT INFO re: COVID VACCINATION:**

For anyone who received a COVID-19 vaccination at the Danube Centre on June 9, 2023 and who has NOT tested positive for COVID since then: You are now eligible for another booster vaccination (as of Nov. 24th). A vaccination clinic will take place at the Bradford Public Library on Monday, December 4, 2023, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. (Sadly, there are no plans for a clinic at the Danube Centre at this time).

If you have tested positive for COVID since your last booster shot, count 168 days from that test date to determine when you will be eligible for another booster shot. (i.e., Jan tested positive for COVID on October 5, 2023. She will be eligible for another booster (Oct. 5 + 168 days -->) on March 21, 2024).

Appointments at the library are not required; walk-ins are welcome.



### Lunch 'n' Learn November 16

Our second Lunch and Learn was on Dementia Basics ably provided by speaker Deb Thomas who is a *Certified Positive Approach to Dementia Care Trainer and Coach*.

Lunch was a delicious potato and leek soup and a sandwich selection and of course, dessert.

Dementia is the result of changes in certain brain regions that cause neurons (nerve cells) and their connections to stop working properly. Changes in the brain may begin a decade or more before symptoms appear. During this very early stage of Alzheimer's, toxic changes are taking place in the brain, including abnormal buildups of proteins that form amyloid plaques and tau tangles.

Deb took care to explain the different types of dementia and especially as some types may not be so obvious initially unless you are with the person constantly and are able to notice small changes. For instance, some family members or friends don't understand that a person is affected because they seem to be fine on occasional visits.

If interest is high enough, we might be able to get Deb to come back for a more extensive presentation.




